MATERIALS COLLECTED

Maximum Load Size – 1 cubic meter per household (size of 2 washing machines)

Remove all batteries from items; place any loose nails/screws in a container.

Household garbage **<u>must</u>** be placed in **CLEAR** plastic bags or it will **<u>not</u>** be accepted.

Metal - 98% metal

- Large appliances (e.g. stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers)
- Misc. scrap metal (e.g. lawn furniture, bed frames, pipes, misc. metal) •
- Fridges & freezers (e.g. contains Freon) ٠
- Lawnmowers, trimmers etc. must have gas and oil removed •
- Prawn and crab traps •

General Garbage

- Durable goods (e.g. stuffed chairs, sofas, mattresses, pink insulation)
- Misc. garbage if bagged, must be in clear plastic bags
- Fish nets **must** be contained in **clear** plastic bags. Loose fish nets not accepted. •

Glass – separate bin

Pane glass - must be removed from frame, broken into pieces and placed in cardboard box

Mixed Household Recyclables* - not bagged

- Cardboard cut into 1 metre x 1 metre pieces and tie together with twine
- Rigid plastic containers clean
- Plastic shopping bags, bread and produce bags
- Glass containers (separate bin) lids off
- Styrofoam food trays and cushion packaging clean

Tin/Aluminium Cans - clean

Electronics and Small Electrical Appliances* - no TVs, monitors, screens or displays; erase personal information

Cell Phones - remove SIM card; erase personal information (www.recyclemycell.ca/recycling-your-device)

Household Batteries* - tape terminals with masking, duct or electrical tape; no lead acid (vehicle) batteries

Wooden Furniture – remove all metal & plastic parts eg. hinges, knobs, sliders; disassemble if possible

MATERIALS NOT COLLECTED

- Boats (e.g. canoes, kayaks, skiffs) ٠
- Construction and demolition waste (e.g. wood, shingles, gypsum, vinyl flooring, vermiculite insulation) •
- Framed glass (e.g. windows, doors) ٠
- Household hazardous waste (e.g. cleaners, pesticides, flammables, oily rags, gas, oil, fireworks) ٠
- Items longer than 12ft •
- Lead acid batteries •
- Organics (e.g. kitchen waste, yard waste) •
- Paint products •
- Propane tanks •
- Tires

MIXED HOUSEHOLD RECYCLABLES

NOTE: Container glass (jars & bottles) will be accepted in a separate bin

Products ACCEPTED *No sorting required, collected loose

ALUMINIUM

- Pop cans, tin foil, rigid trays, pie plates
 - **RINSE** to remove food & grease

BOXBOARD

- Cereal, tissue & detergent boxes; paper egg cartons
 - > MUST be clean & unwaxed with any liners removed
 - > FLATTEN to optimize space

CARDBOARD

- Corrugated boxes
 - > CUT into 1 X 1 metre pieces and TIE together with twine

PAPER

• Newspaper & flyers, magazines, catalogues, telephone directories, books (remove cover from hard-cover books), junk mail, writing paper, computer paper, envelopes, paper gift wrap & cards (remove ribbons and bows), paper bags & rolls, tetra-packs, milk & juice cartons (rinsed), photos & negatives.

PLASTIC

- Containers, jugs, lids, cold drink cups, plant pots, bottles, empty prescription containers
 - RINSE to remove dirt, food & grease

PLASTIC SHOPPING BAGS, BREAD AND PRODUCE BAGS

• BAG OF BAGS, bundle all bags into a plastic shopping bag

STYROFOAM

Food trays/containers/cups, cushion foam for packaging (e.g. around computer)
 RINSE food trays/containers/cups to remove food and grease

TIN CANS

> RINSE, put loose lid in can, pinch closed

Products NOT ACCEPTED

FABRIC

• Clothing, textiles, cloth diapers

FOIL BAGS & WRAP

• Potato chip/candy/food bags, foil gift wrap

FOOD & PET WASTE or any perishables

GLASS

• Light bulbs, mirrors, pottery, dishes, broken glass

PLASTIC

• Tarps, toys, tubes, caulking, motor oil containers, coolers, VHS or cassette tapes, take-out food containers

SOILED PRODUCTS

• Diapers, Q-tips, toilet paper

STYROFOAM

- Peanuts, chips, noodles
- Foam insulation

SYRINGES or medical supplies of any kind

WAXED CARDBOARD

OTHER

• Aerosol cans, wooden items, car parts





NOTE:



- TAPE OVER TERMINALS WITH MASKING, DUCT OR ELECTRICAL TAPE
- REMOVE ALL BATTERIES FROM HOUSEHOLD ITEMS (e.g. flashlights)

Products ACCEPTED

- HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES all terminals must be taped
 - Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Ca)
 - Commonly found in cordless power tools, cordless phones, digital cameras, video cameras, two-way radios
 - Lithium Ion (Li-Ion)
 - Commonly found in cell phones, cordless power tools, laptops, cordless phones, digital cameras, two-way radios
 - Nickel Metal Hydride (NI-MH)
 - > Commonly found in cell phones, digital cameras, two-way radios
 - Nickel Zinc (NI-ZN)
 - Commonly found in small electronics, wireless keyboards, digital cameras
 - Alkaline/Single-Use Batteries
 - Commonly found in alarm clocks, flashlights, TV remote controls, calculators, remote control toys
 - Lithium Primary Batteries
 - > Commonly found in watches, pacemakers, hearing aids

- Non-cellular telephones and answering machines

- Scanners
- Speakers
- Tablets
